The Holy Season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22nd.

- Ashes will be imposed on Ash Wednesday during the Eucharistic liturgies which will be celebrated at 8:30 AM (with the school children) and 7:00 PM.
- **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** are the two days of fast and abstinence of Lent, but all the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (Fasting –eating only one full meal, though some food may be taken at the other two meal times – obliges all those 21 years of age to 60. Abstinence- refraining from meat – obliges all 14 years of age and older).
- On most **Wednesdays of Lent** before Holy Week, Mass will be celebrated at **7:00 PM in addition** to the 8:30 AM Mass.
- On the **Fridays of Lent, the Stations of the Cross** will be prayed at 7:00 PM in one of at least three different formats, either by myself or by Deacon Steve Gies, or by our Leader of Prayer, Joe Humphrey. You are encouraged to take part in this special and traditional Lenten devotion. Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament will also be celebrated on most Fridays. The **St. Joe's Fish Fry** will take place earlier on all the Fridays of Lent before Good Friday. Why not come over to the church after enjoying a delicious Lenten meal?
- A most special Lenten event will be our **Parish Mission, Sunday, March 18, through Wednes-**

Call to Order: The meeting convened at 7:10 p.m. in the meeting room, chairperson Helen Haney presiding. Roll call was taken. In attendance were Rev. Members not in attendance and excused were Deacon Steven Gies, Deacon James White, Kathy Eichler, Deanna Hermann, Dolores Hermann, Carol Kern, Linda Rufener, Larry Schrader.

Opening Prayer: Helen Haney



Approval of Agenda: The November 17 meeting agenda was approved with motion by Fred Matthews and Deb Firtha seconding.

Approval of Minutes: The October 20 meeting minutes were approved with motion by Fred Matthews with Steve Stalter seconding.

Vision: Reviewed and discussed the *Vision 5-Year Plan*, Goal E, Objectives 4, 5, and 6, with revisions discussed and agreed upon. The finalized version of the *Vision 2014* can now be compiled.

Parishioners' Concerns:

- Father Ed presented a letter thanking the parish for the introduction to the new missal.
- Council member presented suggestions for improvement on marriage preparation. These included requiring attendance at the one-day “God’s Plan for a Joy-Filled Marriage” program offered at various locations in the diocese. Father suggested that this could be done early in the marriage preparation process. The second suggestion was to require training in Natural Family Planning, and it was noted that this 8-hour course is also offered on-line.
- The chairperson distributed information for audience attendance for the taping of the “Living Right with Dr. Ray” television program to air on EWTN.

Committee Reports:

The following written reports were submitted, with additional comments noted:

- Worship, October 18
 - ◊ Father is preparing for the different wording of the New Roman Missal.
- Spiritual Life, November 8
 - ◊ The time of the Salem Youth Chorus concert on December 4 was changed to **7:30** p.m.
 - ◊ Additional parishioners are encouraged to sign up for the Adoration Program.
- Finance, October 4
- Building & Grounds, November 3
- Cemetery, September 8
- School Consultative Council, August 10 & September 14
- Evangelization, October 26
 - ◊ Father Ed and Linda Shaw spoke about *Awakening Faith*, a program to welcome inactive Catholics. There will be a training session in January for facilitators.

Parish Reports:

- Pastor: Father Ed highlighted the following items from his written report.
 - ◊ He encouraged attendance at the Community Thanksgiving Service which will take place at St. Joe’s this year on November 20.
 - ◊ He also outlined the Portage County communal penance services which will be scheduled at three different sites on three different days.
- Principal: Beth Frank passed around a sign-up sheet for the 180th anniversary. She also mentioned the goal of \$75,000 for the annual appeal campaign.
- DRE/Pastoral Minister: In addition to the items mentioned in her written report, Linda Shaw stated that the Middle School Youth Group is doing very well.

Old Business:

- The previous suggestion of a High or Latin Mass was tabled.
- No action will be taken on the previous suggestion of padded kneelers and/or seats in the foreseeable future.
- A notice will be placed in the bulletin to inform parishioners of the link on our website concerning entertainment ratings from the Catholic News Service.
- A council member submitted written comments on the Think Tank items. Included in that report was information on a meeting to take place on November 29 concerning the need for storage of parish archives, with information provided at next parish council meeting. Father Ed reiterated that an upstairs guest bedroom could be converted for this purpose.
- An 18-year-old high school senior is to be approached for a seat on Parish Council as the youth member.
- There will be another test weekend on December 4 for the sound system, and more companies will be submitting quotes. A recommendation will be made to the Building & Grounds and Finance committees.

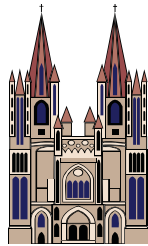
